Mr. Goldberg has lectured at the University of Western Ontario and he was co-chair of the Advisory Board for the Masters of Engineering in Telecommunications at the University of Toronto. He is a member of the Board of Directors for Lakeland Holding Ltd. He also serves on the advisory board for Skysurf Canada Communications. He had previously been an advisor to Xplornet Communications. Mr. Goldberg was a member of the nominating committee for Canada's Telecom Hall of Fame.

He is the co-founder of GST Conferences, a telecommunications industry training and conference company and the producer of the annual Canadian Telecom Summit held in June of each year. GST Conferences has produced training courses used by companies and regulators for new employees.

He is quoted often in such newspapers as the National Post and Globe and Mail and has been a regular commentator on telecom issues for Canada's Business News Network. His OpEds have appeared in the National Post and Hill Times.
